Audience: Facilities Plant Maintenance Technicians (PMTs) who need to be qualified to switch electrical equipment within a specific arc-flash hazard range established by the EHS Electrical Safety Team.

Purpose: The purpose is to understand the rules and conditions for determining what equipment can be switched within the scopes of work typically performed by Facilities Division Non-Electrical crafts.

- Use the Safe Switching Non-electrical Craft workers Field Guide to evaluate whether the equipment can be switched
- Determining if it is safe to switch the equipment
- Determine if/when a standby person is needed
- Control the work area
- Select and Don the appropriate PPE
- Demonstrate safe switching technique
- Perform a pre-job briefing
