Course Syllabus**

Subject Category: Security
Course Length: 15 minutes
Delivery Mode: Web-based Training

Course Prerequisite: None

Frequency: Every other year

Course Purpose: This course is designed for individuals who will or may host a foreign national. The goal of this briefing is to raise your awareness and appraise you how 142.3A is implemented at LBNL. This briefing also covers foreign national requirements related to Export Control and Counterintelligence.

Course Objectives:

Upon completion of this training employees will be able to:

1. Recall the DOE requirements for foreign national access
2. Recall the four terrorist-sponsoring (T-3) countries
3. Recognize who to contact when planning to host a foreign national from a T-3 country
4. Recognize that foreign nationals from T-3 and sensitive countries working require varying levels of approvals
5. Identify who can be a host of a sensitive or terrorist-sponsoring country foreign national
6. Identify the responsibilities for hosting a sensitive or terrorist-sponsoring country foreign national
7. Recognize the importance of export control laws and Recall the concept of "deemed exports"
9. Recall what to do if you notice suspicious behavior or intelligence gathering activities
