PSD 0154 Building Emergency Team (BET) Training Course Syllabus

Subject Category: BET Training

Delivery Mode: Classroom

Course Purpose: Upon completion of this course, the trainee will possess a comprehensive understanding of the role of BET personnel in the Lab's response to an emergency. Further, they will have an understanding of the Emergency Response Organization, the resources necessary to support it and identify the guidelines for protective actions, protective measures, and personnel accountability for Laboratory employees. BET personnel will also learn about the potential emergency events faced by the Laboratory, and safe ways to operate during such events.

Building Emergency Team (BET) personnel assist with the implementation of protective actions (Evacuate, Lockdown, and Shelter-In-Place) and is a first line of defense in facilitating the response to an on-site emergency occurrence. BETs assist with defining the scope of their Building Emergency Plan (BEP) through identification of hazards, essential activities and other facility-specific conditions. BETs analyze hazards during an actual event and provide this information to the Emergency Operations Center (EOC). BETs develop and implement controls through assisting with the implementation of protective actions and crowd control at the Emergency Assembly Areas. Lastly, BETs provide continuous feedback to Protective Services-Emergency Management (PS-EM) through the conduct of building-level drills and BET program initiatives.
